**T**he new obligations in the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005 extend to include the company vehicle as a place of work and state that *'every employer shall ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of his or her employees.'*

Irish road collision statistics makes for disturbing reading as 30% of all road traffic accidents are estimated to be work-related. With 399 fatalities and thousands more seriously injured on Irish roads last year, employers should be taking the correct steps to protect the health, safety and welfare of their company drivers. Employer's who fail to do so, may be committing a criminal offence.
